### TAMIL DIASPORA MEETING IN TORONTO



“The High Commissioner Ms Chitranganee Wagiswara met a group from the Tamil community in Toronto on 9<sup>th</sup> May 2010.

The participants at the meeting extensively discussed issues and concerns with the High Commissioner pertaining to the resettlement of the internally displaced Tamils in the aftermath of the conflict, proposals of the Government of Sri Lanka on political, economic and social integration, and what the Diaspora Tamil community could do to assist in the peace building efforts in Sri Lanka.

The High Commissioner thanked the group for inviting her and stated that such frank discussions encourage building trust between the communities and that she hopes to build on the proposals and discussions at the forum.

The High Commissioner was accompanied by Mr H M B Herath Actg. Consul General Toronto and Ms Anzul Jhan, Counsellor of the High Commission in Ottawa.



### IDPs BENEFIT FROM CASH FOR WORK



Cash for Work Program has been initiated to provide an income to returning Internally Displaced People by the Emergency Northern Recovery Project (ENRP) with Australian Government aid.

Under this program, 50 days of employment is guaranteed and Rs 500 will be paid per day to the returnees. Under the program the first 10 days allocated to clean and repair their own households and private property, and next 40 days to clean common places such as schools and hospitals.

At present the program has now reached about 17,000 households and the program hopes to cover 43,000 households. The Australian Government has donated Rs12 million for this programme.
